WFIS EUROLETTER



First WFIS Pathfinderbelt achieved by Rovers of the Solmser Pfadfinderschaft

Since a couple of years the program exists – the "WFIS Pathfinder-Belt" trophy for Rover groups.

The target is to visit a foreign country and do there a (self-selected) major project and to complete 10 different tasks, given by the steering committee.

After already a German-Swiss Rover team started in 2006, followed by a Spanish Rover crew in 2007, this year a group of 7 Solmser Rovers headed for Russia to work on their Pathfinder Belt project over there.

More than 6000 Kms. were travelled via car, plane, ship, canoes, railway, by foot and horseback through the remote Taiga-Areas.

Major project was the research on Russian Scout History – from the foundation in 1909 through scouting in exile to the latest developments after the end of communist area in 1991.

Assigned projects lead the group to remote villages along the Volga river, cooking of a typical Russian meal, the role of the Orthodox Church in modern culture, research of leisure time activities of Russian youth, an interview with an elderly person about the changes during the past 20 years etc.

First information was gathered from internet and various publications, and a lot of research activities in Russia had to be added (altogether more than 150 working hours during 11 days in Russia for the 7 members of the team).

The Pathfinderbelt project proved to be a valuable tool for Rovering, as it led to close co-operation with Rovers of the Russian Union of scouts, contact to local people and a lot of information about the Russian culture.

A museum-village with typical dwellings of the Volga-region was visited, and together with the Russian Rovers excursions in cross-country vehicles led to remote villages in the Taiga region.

Orthodox churches were visited and a trip on the Volga river was undertaken. The Taiga was discovered in a haijk with canoes, on foot or horseback.

In August, the project was finalised with a presentation for members of the steering committee to successfully complete the task.

The 7 Solmser Rover are proud to have achieved the first WFIS Pathfinderbelts and are sure, that similar Pathfinderbelt projects will follow in other countries in the near future.

WFIS Pathfinderbelt – a program the only can highly be recommended to all Rovers throughout WFIS.



New Wood Bead Training started

14 participants, coming from 6 German and **Swiss WFIS** Organisations started a new Wood bead training for "Stammesleiter" (scoutleaders in charge of several groups in a particular city or region). The training consists of the traditional modules like legal aspects, child protection, leadership and management techniques, scout history and combine these with questions, individual interviews and a major project. All these specially assigned to the typical scout organisations in Germany and Switzerland.

The first modules took place in the training centre of the Solmser Pfadfinderschaft and WFIS near Laubach/Germany in August and September.

As there is a lot of interest in many of our member organizations, it is planned to run another Wood Bead course for "Stammesleiter" in 2009. An invitation will be sent out in a few months.



GONE HOME



Our beloved, well known and most veteran scout nationwide Mr. Joan Acosta Jurado "Oso Viejo" (Old Bear), 91, passed away in his sleep early Tuesday, April 14, 2009

He was born in 1917 in Cadiz, Spain, and raised in Havana (Cuba) in a short period of time. Old Bear joined 'Boy Scouts de Catalunya' on 1933 in **Palamos** (Girona Province) but regretfully the Spanish Civil War (1936-1939) kept him far his from scout commitments. Franco's regime began Scouting was definitely banned so he was invited to join the Falange Youth Front but refused the offer like many other former scouts.



This situation remained in the cold up to 1960's when, step by step, started some underground scout activities among youth in the area as always kept contact with his former comrades in Scouting. In 1976 founded his first real boy

scout group in Palamos and also helping and leading others placed in Figueres, Calonge and Palafrugell, the 1980's gold years. Afterwards due to old age, Oso Viejo left active Scouting and founded the Girona B.-P. Guild "Mongoo".

Old Bear awarded the Long Service Knot and the Perseverance Medal of ASDE-Scouts of Spain but after certain bitter experiences, lack support to Girona groups and deep changes in Spanish WOSM Scouting held during the 1990's, joined Associació de Catalana **Scouts** (WFIS) as Honorary Member, receiving welldeserve honours and attention ever. Old Bear awarded the ACS Silver Wolf in 2006, but he always said the best reward was being witness of the B-P Scouting guidelines reborn (under WFIS flag), as always fascinated him.

May God rest is soul in eternal peace! Be Prepared!

ON 'SURVIVAL HIKE' WITH VZW SCOUTSGROEP DE ZWALUW (BELGIUM)

SCOTLAND 2008

Every year the scouts and guides of our group are going to another country for a 5 days hike and a 5 days exploration of the area in the country. So we hiked and explored in the past Norway, Spain, Germany, Switzerland, Italy, France, Austria and of course Belgium. Now went for a second time to Scotland.

During the last week of June and the first week of July we travelled with 15 scouts and guides to Scotland for a hike into the Cairnhorn Mountains.

At the beginning of the hike (the Shepherds bridge over the river Calder)

The nature was pure and very hard but amazing and beautiful. We could stay in Lagan village (very small old village), there we were hosted the Laggan Village Hall for a temporary stay.

The second day we already left the hall direction the mountains were we hiked and tried to reach the lake Mc. Dubh, high into the mountains and approximately two day's walk to reach it.

A lake out of view and rarely visited because it lay's high into the mountain. The lake is being feed by several (mostly 7) sources and lays between three mountaintops. It is one of the main sources for the river Calder, an not so small river. The view from there was wonderful and worth the walk up (a real difficult walk).

After that we returned and did some geological research in the area. (Finding mountain crystals and even some silver). We encountered one problem: couldn't make any fire! As we understand that fire can be a disaster for the wildlife in the Highlands, that's why an open fire is not allowed.

We cocked our meals on small esbit-fires. (very small metal construction with fire tablets). Also In Scotland there is a law that permits you may go everywhere you want respecting always the nature, properties and owners, etc. After the hike we visited and did a lot of exploration in Scotland. So we had a good look about the whole history of Scotland vs Europe. Good to know. Very nice people these Scottish... once they know you at least.

We plan a trip to France next years and shall hike into the 'European Rocky Mountains' the Gorges du Verdon, we already look forward to this!
