"I am International Commissioner for B-PSA, and have met many of you at General Assemblies, Workshops and Eurocamps.



This is the first Eurocamp that hasn't been in mainland Europe, and that means that for the first time many of you will be thinking about how to get Scouts, Leaders and equipment across that stretch of water that separates us.

I will be using all the experience of UK Groups who have had to solve those problems before, to give you advice on transport solutions including road, rail, air,

and ferries. There will be a full feature on this in the September newsletter.

I will also be giving you helpful contact information for UK bus companies that can get you to the Eurocamp18 site, and I'll be responsible for making sure the transport goes smoothly on trip and hike days."

"As Chairman of WFIS Europe, I am the steering committee representative on the Eurocamp18 team. I will be making sure that everything is planned to give our members the best opportunities of creating lifelong Scouting friendships."



### **Registrations update**

In less than 2 months since the launch of Eurocamp 18 we have had a fantastic amount of interest, and the current registrations already show that over 700 people are interested in attending.

Countries who have already registered include:- Austria, Canada, Denmark, Germany, Italy, Malta, Spain, UK, and USA.

## Funding from Europe

We have had initial discussions with the Erasmus Plus programme about funding a youth exchange programme - and it's looking positive.

If we put in a successful application, we will be able to get up to 60 young people totally funded (camp and travel) to attend Eurocamp18.

Please let us know if you have Scouts who will only be able to come, if they get funding support of this type. That will help us to put together a very good application. We need to know:- the likely numbers of Scouts involved, why they can't afford to travel in Europe normally, and your thoughts on the benefits to them if they were able to attend Eurocamp18.
