

We have developed the following hikes for you:

- Hike for Cubs to the Attersee and back, boat trip on the lake
- For young Scouts: Hike to the Schoberstein, 580 m elevation gain, and to the Mahdlgupf and Dachsteinblick, 1.100 m elevation gain.
- **Hike 27 km** (6 hours), from the camp to Kogl, lookout tower Lichtenberg, Attersee and back to the camp
- Hike 50 km, from the camp to the tower Lichtenberg,
   Alpenseebad Mondsee and back to the camp.

You can do the following sight-seeing tours:

- Trip to Hallstatt (Salt mines)
- Trip to Salzburg
- Ice cave Dachstein
- Trip to Gut Aiderbichl (Animal sanctuary)

There is also the option of doing a high ropes course in the camp.

There will be a meeting point in every subcamp called "Dorfplatz". There you can end the evening around the campfire until 10 p.m., meet friends, get information, and so on.

We hope we have chosen a nice campsite for you in the middle of Austria and our program has awakened your longing to be a member of the Eurocamp22.

Pleas note that it can only be possible to hold a nice Eurocamp22 if everyone really helps and is actively involved.

There is also a camp song, this is currently being chosen. We will inform you about the camp song and also ask you to learn lyrics and also to sing so that we can form a scout choir of over 2.000 voices at the opening and closing ceremony.

# SILVER AND GOLD ON THE MISTY ISLE

he Isle of Skye may be known as the misty isle, but the four teams of Baden-Powell Scouts tackling silver and gold expeditions in August 2019 encountered everything from glorious sunshine to wind blasted and drenching rain.

The Baden-Powell Scouts' Association (B-PSA) was formed in 1970 and proudly embraces traditional Scouting skills, values and uniform. Our Scout (11 – 15 year old), Senior Scout (15 – 18 year old) and Rover Scout programmes are still closely aligned to Baden-Powell's writings in Scouting

for Boys – and they align perfectly with the Duke of Edinburgh Award scheme. Every other year the B-PSA run their Discovery Award in wild country, and participants can choose to also use this as their qualifying DofE expedition. The Discovery Award is also open to Rover Scouts, who are aged over 18, and we also had two teams of Rovers in the hills at the same time.

Base camp was in Elgol, with stunning views over Loch Scavaig to the Cuillin

Hills. On Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> August old friends were reunited and new friendships formed as Scouts from as far apart as Bristol and the Northumberland borders gathered in Elgol. Sunday was acclimatisation, kit check and route planning day – and we thank the village of Elgol for welcoming us into their community hall.

Each team planned a circular route to include three wild camps and the luxury of visiting base camp with it's portaloo facilities. Each team planned to start at a different camp site, with two taking a clockwise route, and the others going anticlockwise. This allowed teams to walk independently, but meet other teams in the evening at camp sites. All routes included a circuit of Loch Coruisk, a crossing of the saddle between Coire nan Laogh and Coire



na Seilg between the Sligachan valley and Loch Ainort, and a visit to the deserted village of Boreraig. Our host told us about the significance and impact to the island, it's people and it's economy of the village clearings of the 1850s, which gave the participants a far better perspective of the ruins in Boreraig. The DofE Scotland office provide invaluable information which helps with route planning and

safety for expeditions on the island.

In the spirit of leaving no trace of our journeys, all participants agreed to carry poo pots and bio degradable bags so that all human waste could be carried out of the expedition area and we didn't need to dig or disturb the fragile eco systems of the wild camp spots.

All routes were planned to cover at least 20kms per day, and wild camp spots included Loch Coruisk, the shores of Loch Ainort and Boreraig. The routes

provided a remote and interesting challenge to the walking teams through stunning scenery but always lower than 400 metres. They also provided an interesting challenge to our supervision and assessment team, which included three MLs and a paramedic – we opted to hire spot trackers to be carried by each team, so that as well as having remote supervision on the ground, our base control had an ongoing over view of progress.

All four teams had an amazing expedition, and their rigorous training paid dividends when planned routes needed to be revised due to heavy rainfall turning some streams into obstacles that couldn't be crossed.

At the end of the expedition we decided to give something back to the misty isle as our good turn, to thank the island

and its residents for their warm welcome and hospitality. Access to the beach below Elgol is difficult from the land, but the beach appears to be a magnet attracting huge amounts of rubbish brought in on the tide and currents. So on our final day on Skye and despite expedition weary bodies, all participants and the support team undertook a beach clean.

The five huge sacks of rubbish that were man handled up the cliffs to remove them from the beach, included things as large as half a sofa and as tiny as the micro filaments of polypropylene rope that devastates marine life. A good turn – well done and well appreciated – and a great way to build an appetite for the farewell barbecue.

What lessons would we pass on to anyone planning to visit Skye for an expedition?

- Come well prepared its almost impossible to buy any last minute expedition requirements on the island
- Scottish open access rules mean that magnificent routes

- can be planned, but progress can be very slow across boggy moorland with no footpaths
- Mobile phone coverage is patchy at best, and largely nonexistent – supervision plans need to take this into account, and we found spot trackers a useful supplement
- Weather on Skye is unpredictable and bad weather planning is essential
- Water supply was plentiful, allowing significant use of wild camps – our participants used a combination of purification tablets and life straws successfully
- Wind and rain are a welcome respite from the attentions of the Scottish midge – don't forget to take repellent and midge hats.

Congratulations to the Scouts and Senior Scouts who completed their Discovery Award and DofE expeditions. I know how tough, rewarding and memorable an experience it will be, as I experienced it too as a member of one of the Rover teams.



We hope to see you soon,



# **PIONET... 2021**

- > It's for all European Patrols
- > 2 phases in which the Patrols will be evaluated
- > the Patrols will have to work very hard to win!


Let's start with the name...why PIONET...?
It is the union of two words:

**PIONEERING** (we won't even explain it, because if you don't know what it means ... your Patrol will not even be last !!) and

**NET**..., as network, it is meant in the sense of connection between several people, in fact, the activity of a Patrol is the sum of the work of its Scouts!

PIONET... is a pioneering competition for Patrols, with complex and elaborate pioneering constructions, with an adequate design, a perfect technical realization and an equally important presentation of the construction.

The final result will be the sum of the work of the Patrols, so the report will have to show in particular the contribution that each Scout has given.





# THE ACTIVITY SHOULD BE DEVIDED INTO TWO PHASES:

**First phase:** (due to Coronavirus for this phase the Patrols can meet online with zoom or skype meetings or whatever they prefer): each Patrol must do a complete design of the structure and calculation of the materials and a report in English must be submitted, as detailed as possible, by June 30, 2021. The report must include the name, a photo and the role of each Scout in the Patrol.

**Second phase:** realization and consequently, submission of a detailed report with photographs by December 31, 2021.

The works will be evaluated by "professionals". The sum of the votes of each individual phase will provide the final classification.

There will be three prizes for the first three classified Patrols.

Each Scout that participated will receive a badge and each Patrol a participation certificate.
