WORKSHOP WFIS 2023 IN THE CZECH REPUBLIC

The workshop in September 2023 took place in the Czech Republic at the Orlova Grove.

It is the place where the founder of Czech scouting Antonín Benjamin Svojsík translated the book "Scouting for boys" and also wrote a publication essential for all Czech scouts "Základy junáctví" ("The basics of scouting").

Orlovy lies in the beautiful countryside of the Bohemian-Moravian Highlands surrounded

by forests. The first Czech scout camp was held near the grove in 1912.

Around 40 participants from Germany, England, Romania, Malta, Denmark and Italy came together.

Among the activities on offer, carving, leather decorating and rework were the most popular. The other activities as tee-pee building and fire-making had fewer takers.

Those interested could also go and see the site of the first Czech Scout camp. In the evening we all sat around the campfire.

The kitchen team was a great success with their work and prepared many goodies for the participants. Everyone enjoyed the workshop and took home many memories of a nice meeting. The success consisted of the following ingredients - beautiful weather, good food, a place with special atmosphere and the good will and spirit of all participants.

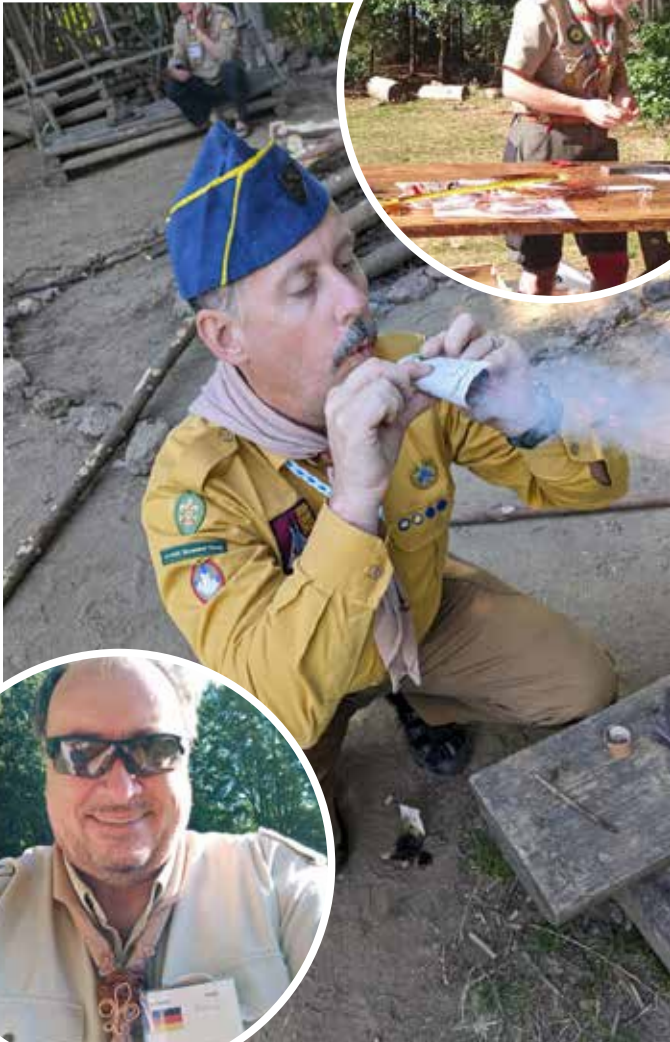

THE PEACE LIGHT OF BETHLEHEM

Since 1986, each year, a child from Upper Austria kindles a flame from the “Eternal Flame” from the Nativity Grotto in Bethlehem where Jesus was born. The light is then flown to Austria from where it is distributed at a Service of Dedication to delegations from across Europe who take it back, with a message of Peace, to their own countries.

There has been a great deal of co-operation between Scouts and Guides in many countries which has allowed the light to travel throughout Europe, such that the light is passed on to 30 European Countries and for the past few years, on to North America, Mexico, and Canada.

Scouts can then take the light on to other churches, hospitals, old people homes, prisons, and places of public, cultural and political importance - to anybody that appreciates the significance of the “gift”.

We are well aware that this ceremony, done mainly in churches, can have some connotations of faith, of the belief of a particular religion (Christian...), but the message that is proclaimed with that symbol is so universal that it can be understood, accepted and shared by any belief without the need to be Christian.

BUT, for the times in which we live in and due to the conflicts, that we are astonished to witness, especially wars in which many children suffer the consequences... we thought it would have been very nice, due to the strong message that it carries, to receive from WFIS scout groups and associations their contribute with pictures and a small text of their testimony.

Since the early 90th, Solmsers Pfadfinder take part in this unique program. In the earlier years, we had to travel from Laubach to Fulda (80 kilometres over a high mountain, sometimes in snow or on icy roads). The light was transported back in kerosene lamps (several lamps to be ready in case the light got extinguished...). In later years, the train-transportation-network was extended so we were able to collect the light at a near-by train station. In Laubach, candles were handed over to the protestant and catholic churches, where the light was kept burning until after Christmas and usually played a prominent role during Christmas services. The local community was informed, and many families collected their light from the churches or visited scout leaders to get it from their homes. The first year we participated in the program, one of

our adult scouts was a priest in a village 25 kilometres away and he invited us to a service in his church, which he arranged around the Peace light and told us the stories behind it. We sang songs from Israel and gave a presentation. In many houses of our scouts the Peace light is kept burning until Christmas. As we have in our house still natural candles on our Christmas tree it is illuminated on Christmas eve with the Peace light! In the night, we bring candles with the Peace light to the graveyard to illuminate the graves of our beloved ones throughout the Christmas days. After some years, we started a new tradition, which we run every three years. Starting with a short send-out service in one of our churches scouts and their families who





live in the villages around Laubach walk to their villages and hand over the light to the churches there and bring it to people, who asked for the light (based upon earlier advertisements). At these churches, families and scouts from the next villages are waiting, take over the light and walk with it to their villages. In some years, the starlike routes walked total up to more than 50 kilometres!

Cars driven by our scoutmasters are present at all those meeting points and supply warm drinks and snacks and return the kerosene lamps from the final destination. There is always a reserve light in these cars in case one of the lights transported around extinguishes.

In the past two years, our priest was invited by the regional TV Station to talk about Christmas traditions. In both years, he presented the Peace light, which he had received from us.

In 2023 it was a bit complicated as a war had broken out in the holy land. So, it was unclear, if at all the light could be brought from the church in Bethlehem. So, arrangements could only be made on a short notice after it was clear, that the light had arrived in Vienna. And as we heard, it was for the first time that it wasn't transported in a plane leaving from Tel Aviv (as in all the years before) but had to be transported to Amman in Jordan and came in a plane from there... (I assume, it was done so for security reasons, as still rockets were fired towards the airport in Tel Aviv).

How much has changed in the Holy Land. In 1978 my wife Nati and I toured the area for a week in a rented car. We were able to travel free not only through Israel, but as well through the Westbank and the Gaza strip. When we came to the "Birth-Church" in Bethlehem, there was a parking place right in front of it. We entered the church – a fortified church with thick walls, only accessible through a small door which can only be passed by one person at a time – and went down the stairs to see the

place, where Jesus Christ was born and stood there for some time to watch the eternal flame. Close to the church there was the "Field of the Shepards" where we bought the nativity figures we use underneath our Christmas tree ever since.

In 2019 we had another chance to visit the birth church in Bethlehem, as there was a one-day stopover on a vacation trip in the North-Israeli city of Haifa. This time, we decided to go on a guided tour in a tourist bus. For many kilometres our trip went along a huge fence, which has been erected in the meantime to prevent terrorist from the West back to enter Israel. As Bethlehem is located just a mile behind the border in the Westbank, we had to pass a security checkpoint and a long queue of cars and busses was waiting there. Nowadays there is no longer a chance to cross this border in a rental-car... where there used to be the Shepard's Field there are now huge buildings and within this area there is a big parking garage – exclusively for tourist busses! Of course there was another long queue in front of the small entrance door and inside the church we had to learn, that the waiting line was so long, that it would have been taken more than one hour to get a chance to step down to the eternal light – too long for our tough time-schedule... We were happy, that we had had to possibility to see the place 41 years earlier...

It really became a sad and oppressive feeling for us. After seeing all these (negative) changes, we are glad and happy that we are still able to receive this important call for peace in the world – the Peace light of Bethlehem – each and every year until today. We hope that this great tradition will continue – despite all those negative changes, terrorism attacks and wars - in the years to come.

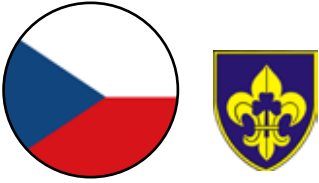


Once again, this year, the Bethlehem light of Peace was welcomed by the Scouts belonging to the A.S.C.I. Esploratori e Guide d'Italia and brought to the parishes of various localities. The precious flame, which has been burning for centuries in the Basilica of the Nativity in Bethlehem, travelled by rail throughout Italy. Our Scouts picked it up among other groups:

Casandrino I, Valdaso 1, Merano 3, Iseo 1, Valconca 1 and Palermo 1, who collected it at the railway stations closest to their locations and made it available to those who, understanding its value and meaning, wanted to pick it up and take it to their homes, PEACE is the heritage of all humanity and should be spread as widely as possible.

Representatives of the “Lesní moudrost” (Forest Wisdom) group from Brno went to collect the Bethlehem Light for the first time in 1995, when they were part of a delegation of Brno Scouts and received the Light for the first time in Vienna from Austrian Scouts. Representatives of the Lesní moudrost group went to Vienna regularly for the next 15 years. Since 1995, the Hitchhikers unit have been distributing the Bethlehem

Light around their neighbourhood to households according to a list of selected addresses at the end of the Christmas party on 23 December. There was only a forced break during the Covid period, nowadays we continue the tradition of distributing the light from Bethlehem. The Bethlehem Light from the Boy Scouts brings some peace and reflection on the original meaning of Christmas.

Distributing the Bethlehem Light has a long tradition in our town. We first shared the Light of peace in 1989 and this tradition has not been broken yet. Czech scouts distribute the light across the whole country by train. After we pick up the Bethlehem Light at the train, around mid-December, we keep it burning in several households until the 23rd of December, when we organize an event for all interested people from our town in the main square. Every year on the same date and time. Scouts and Girl Scouts from our troop bring the Light in a parade to the sound of jingle bells, followed by the singing of carols. People have long got used to the event and come in large numbers with their lanterns to bring home the Light from Bethlehem. On this occasion we always meet many familiar faces, wish each other a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year and above all we always remind ourselves that Christmas is a holiday of peace and joy. Together with the Light, we all take this feeling back to our homes.

The first “meeting” between FederScout and the Light of Peace took place in Trieste in 1995. Some Austrian Scouts, guests of AMIS-FEDERSCOUT, spoke about the Light that they took in Bethlehem and which, after bringing it to Vienna, distributed throughout the Northern Europe, including Russia. This did not happen, however, in Italy through the Italian Scout Associations. AMIS immediately liked the idea and, in particular Fabiano, managed to organize a group of leaders to go and get the Light and start distributing it in Italy. The first trip with a minibus in December 1995!!! Until December 2000 AMIS took care of transport and distribution with the collaboration of the Italian Railways reaching many cities, after that year a Committee was created in Trieste among all the Italian Scout Associations which distribute everywhere, and always with the collaboration of the Railways , the Light of Peace.

In December 2003 it was delivered to Pope John Paul II, with a special crystal lamp, by a Cub from the AV-SC-FEDERSCOUT together with a Leader of MASCI Association. Every year FEDERSCOUT participates in the distribution of the Light of Peace to families, hospitals, churches, prisons and wherever this sign of peace can help hope for a better future.

1. Take a picture of your Cubs and leaders.

 - ▶ What they are doing at their meetings; ▶ Who they are; ▶ Maps and information about the city they live in
 - ▶ Maps and information about the country they live in; ▶ Stories from summer camps; ▶ Great drawings
 - ▶ Anything else your Cubs want to tell about.; ▶ One picture of the Cubs and leaders.

The Cubs have to make one information package.

3. From the leader of the project you will get the e-mail address of the Cub Pack you will be sending to. You must then e-mail to get the details and address of where you have to send your package.
4. You must post your package to the given address. Your Cubs will get one package from the Cub Pack you have contacted and you have to share the information you get with the rest of the Cubs in your Pack.
5. When you have posted your package you have to tell the project leader by e-mail. The leader will, if you have ordered them on the registration form, send you the badges.

PIONET... 2024

- ▶ **It's for all European Patrols**
- ▶ **2 phases** in which the Patrols will be evaluated
- ▶ the Patrols will have to work very hard to win!

PIONET... is a pioneering competition for Patrols, with complex and elaborate pioneering constructions, with an adequate design, a perfect technical realization and an equally important presentation of the construction.

The final result will be the sum of the work of the Patrol, so the report will have to show in particular the contribution that each Scout has given.

THE ACTIVITY SHOULD BE DEVIDED INTO TWO PHASES:

1 First phase: each Patrol must do a complete design of the structure and calculation of the materials and a report in English must be submitted, as detailed as possible, by **June 30, 2024**. The report must include the name, a photo and the role of each Scout in the Patrol.

2 Second phase: realization and consequently, submission of a detailed report with photographs by **December 15, 2024**.

All reports must be sent by email to: pionet@wfis-europe.org

- The works will be evaluated by "professionals". The sum of the votes of each individual phase will provide the final classification.
- There will be three prizes for the first three classified Patrols.
- Each Scout that participated will receive a badge and each Patrol a participation certificate.
