ACCOMMODATION

In the hostel there will be dormitory with toilets. You need to take with you sleeping bag and towels.

Meals will be from Friday's dinner till Sunday's breakfast. Any special dietary requirements are very important to put down on the registration form.

WORKSHOPS

Will be held in two sessions which will be in the morning and in the afternoon. Each

participant can choose two activities, one in the morning and one in the afternoon.

Now we have:

- How to light fires, with multiple techniques
- How to make a bag or knife sheath
- How to engrave on leather
- Traditional cusine
- Grape pressing
- How to make a camp stove in a can
- Visit to the archaeological park of Sutri (to be confirmed)
- We will add others and we will send you informations



Archaeological park of Sutri









As you can see from the railway map, coming from Fiumicino Airport, or other places as Ciampino Airport or Termini Railway Station, you have to reach Roma Ostiense Railway Station to take trains for Capranica-Sutri Station (near Bassano Romano), these kind of trains are all direction VITERBO.

- From **Fiumicino Airport**, you can take all trains, **BUT NOT TRAINS DIRECTION ROMA TERMINI**, they do not stop at Roma Ostiense. You have trains at 30-minute intervals, or less, from 07:27 in the morning (07:27, 07:57, 08:27, 08:57 and so on), that will reach Roma Ostiense in about 31 minutes.
- The last one that is useful to reach in the night Capranica Station is at 20:42 that will reachRoma Ostiense at 21.13 and from there at 22:05 towards CESANO where a railway bus will start at 23:08 and reach Capranica Station at 23:45.
- Trains from Roma Ostiense to Capranica-Sutri Station (direction VITERBO), on working days, leave every hour 11:52, 12:52, 13:52 after 15:02, 16:02, 17:02 and every half an hour 17:32, 18:02, 18:32, 19:02, 19:32, then 19:52, 20:52 the last one, as written before, is at 22:05.

All trains will reach Capranica Station in (about) one hour and a half from Rome

The opportunity is here!! We are excited to introduce you to The SDG Challenge, a truly inspiring competition launched to the entire Scout brotherhood of WFIS-Europe.

It's a challenge designed to recognise and reward the commitment and footprint of Scouts in the application of the SDGs in your activities through the Scout Method.

Think of all those activities you've been doing, but without thinking about the SDGs.

Whether it's activities you've already started, ones you've committed to sustainability, or brand new ones you're eager to create for this event, we want to hear all about it!

This exciting competition is your opportunity to discover, value and amplify the incredible impact of the activities that scouts of all ages, from beaver colonies to rover communities, are doing to contribute to a more just, equitable and sustainable world.



This is your chance to show that together, stronger, we can change the world!

WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?

All scout branches of our federation are invited to participate, from Beavers to Rovers.

Every action count, no matter how big or small your section is.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

For this challenge, activities will be scored according to the following criteria:

- **1. Number of participants:** Which section took part in the challenge, how many members of your patrol, section or group took part in the activity?
- **2. Involvement and commitment:** Explain and show how did the participants motivate themselves and work together to achieve the goal?
- **3.Duration of the activity:** to reflect the level of commitment to the cause, indicate the time spent and the planning schedule involved.
- **4.Impact achieved:** The impact of each activity is measured according to five levels:
- **Discovery** (e.g. attending a conference on the SDGs).
- Knowledge (e.g. attending workshops with training, exercises, workshops, simulations, scenarios).
- Engagement (e.g. organise a public communication cam-

paign in your neighbourhood and get a response from your environment).

- Action (e.g. propose a concrete project to address an SDG and one of its missions).
- Transformation (e.g. implement a transformative action through a project and obtain key outcome indicators of change).





SO, HOW CAN YOU GET INVOLVED?... EASY!!

- **1. Get creative and organise your activity:** Design a Beaver/Cub/ Scout/Rover/Group/Association activity that works around one or more of the SDGs, or one or more of their targets.
- **2. Register your activity:** yearly, you could complete the form (QR) on our official platform before 01/June, so that we have proof that you are participating.
- **3. Then, document your impact:** before 01/November of the same year provide evidence (photos, videos, testimonials, etc.), indicate the mission(s) addressed and explain the impact achieved, according to the criteria indicated in your performance.
- **4. Then, submit your project:** Collect all this information in a dossier (preferably in a .pdf file) and send it to the contact e-mails before 01/November.

AWARDS

The three most outstanding entries will be awarded at a special ceremony to be held in 2030. At this ceremony they will receive exclusive certificates and badges, for the third, second and first

place of the best entries received during five years for each section (Beavers, Cub Scouts, Scout and Senior Troops, Pioneers and Clan). Annually, until 2030, three finalists will be selected and announced on the GA, for which a special section will be reserved in an issue of the EUROLETTER.

It's in your hands to change the world!

Now is the time to show that the Scout spirit can make a real difference in our society and on our planet. As our motto says, be prepared! This challenge is more than a competition; it is an opportunity for you and your team/section... to be agents of change and leave an indelible imprint on the world.



The winning Patrol REVOLVING DOOR

Nation: Spain



Patrol: Cheetahs

Materials: 3 large trunks, 2 long thin sticks, 1 short thin

stick, string.

Description: Materials to cut the trunks (saws and axes). Watering cans and material to nail the trunk to the ground, 1 kilo metal can of preserves. Initially, we looked for the trunks, cut them so that they would fit the necessary size and not have splinters. We took a tree from the area as a base and nailed the largest trunks to the ground (with the hoe, the pick, watering can...). After doing that, we took the other two large trunks and with them made two ties at each end to join the trunk nailed by them to the tree. We did this in order for it to rotate, for this we took a can of preserves at the bottom and the thin, short stick at the top to make the turn. Finally, we put the other two thin sticks, tied in a cross, achieving the objective of making the door revolving.

- > It's a project for everybody!
- > Each work will be carefully evaluated considering the age of each participant

This project can be done by anybody, from the youngest Beaver to the oldest Rover.

It is very simple, all it is to be done is a homemade handicraft, it could be a drawing, a pioneer model built in scale, or sew a leather sheath for the axe, or anything that is Scouting and that **can be done at home or with your leaders during the activities.**

There will be a winner and each participant will receive a participation certificate.

THE ACTIVITY WILL HAVE ONLY ONE PHASE:

Each participant must send by October 31, 2025 a maximum of 4 photos of his/her handicraft by e-mail to handcraft@wfis-europe.org indicating: name, surname, association, group and, most important of all, the age!

Each participant may participate with only one handicraft.

So... start working! The judges are already waiting to see all your wonderful works!



PIONET... 2025

- ► It's for all European Patrols
- ▶ 2 phases in which the Patrols will be evaluated
- ▶ the Patrols will have to work very hard to win!

PIONET... is a pioneering competition for all European Patrols, with an adequate design, a technical realization and an equally important presentation of the construction.

The final result will be the sum of the work of the Patrol, so the report will have to show in particular the contribution that each Scout has given.

THE ACTIVITY SHOULD BE DEVIDED INTO TWO PHASES:

First phase: each Patrol must do a complete design of the structure and calculation of the materials and a report in English must be submitted, as detailed as possible, by June 30, 2025. The report must include the name, a photo and the role of each Scout in the Patrol.

2Second phase: realization and consequently, submission of a detailed report with photographs by December 15, 2025.

All reports must be sent by email to: pionet@wfis-europe.org

- The works will be evaluated by "professionals".
 The sum of the votes of each individual phase will provide the final classification.
- There will be three prizes for the first three classified Patrols.
- Each Scout that participated will receive a badge and each Patrol a participation certificate.
